Application Instructions and Information

As of 2023, all applications must go through the Jury process before being accepted into the market. The Prescott Indian Art Market (PIAM) is a juried market and complies with the Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990. The Jury, comprised of members of the Indian Arts Advisory Council for PIAM, will examine all applications for new and returning artists to select those artists who will be invited to show at PIAM. Please follow the instructions outlined below when submitting artwork to the Jury for selection.

Eligibility: In compliance with the Indian Arts and Crafts Act, all artists must submit a copy of a Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) or proof of tribal enrollment with the application. This information will be kept confidential.

Types of Artwork: Any items that the artist wishes to display or sell must be submitted to the Jury for approval. Only those items that have been juried may be displayed or sold. All artwork must be handcrafted by the exhibiting artist. No imported, manufactured, or mass-produced items will be allowed. **No dealers, traders, guilds, or cooperatives will be invited.**

Images: The Jury bases its evaluation on digital images of the artist's work. These should be high-quality digitized images to best represent the art. For each selected art category, a minimum of four different items for each category must be included as digitized files with the application. Images may be submitted on a thumb drive or CD with the application (if requested, all CDs and thumb drives will be returned to the applicant), or as attachments only in an email to PIAM@sharlothallmuseum.org. **Note:** Please attach a maximum of four images per email. Each image should be labeled with the artist's name. Please type "PIAM application photos" in the subject line of the email.

Title and Size of Artwork: Please provide a title, if any, for each piece of art that the Jury is to consider, and the dimensions of each piece. This pertains particularly to paintings, photography, carvings, and sculptures.

Materials and Methods: Provide descriptive information on the materials used in the selected art, and the methods and processes used in its creation. The PIAM jury expects detailed information on how each piece is produced, including how the raw materials are acquired, tools and techniques used, and finishing processes.

Personal Information: The artist may submit additional information to be considered by the Jury, such as formal art training or relevant degrees earned, a summary of Indian Markets where the artist has represented his/her artwork, and any awards, ribbons, or prizes received. Artists must be at least 18 years of age, unless accompanied by a parent.

The application and non-refundable \$20 application Fee must be submitted/postmarked no later than May 15, 2023. Late applications will not be accepted. Send application, CIB or tribal enrollment verification, images, and check or money order (payable to "Sharlot Hall Museum") to
